1	SEE MAP FOR LOCATION
	From the parking lot for the Old Man Historic

	boulder on your left. The Old Man, the Cannon
	Cliffs, and this boulder are called Conway
	Granite. What color is Conway Granite?

2 SEE MAP FOR LOCATION

Visit the **small log cabin** further along the path to the Plaza. Inside check out the large mural on the back wall. One of New Hampshire's grand hotels, the first **Profile House**, opened in...

1923 2003 1853

- Many tourists came to the **Profile House** (often for the whole summer season) by horse & carriage, train and even automobiles. What happened to the **Profile House**?

  Next you come to a new wooden bridge over the brook that flows into Profile Lake. This little brook is the start of the Pemigewasset River. The Pemi flows south to Franklin NH where it joins the Winnipesaukee River to become the Merrimack River. The Merrimack River continues to which ocean?

Walking further along the pathway, notice the different types of trees. There is a mixture of hardwoods and conifers making this a Boreal Forest. Do you recognize any of the trees you see here?

Early attempts to keep the Conway granite rocks of the Old Man Profile in place up on the Cannon Mountain cliffs involved installing metal turnbuckles. Members of the *Nielson family* helped with yearly inspections of the Old Man. When the Old Man fell on May 3rd, 2003 one of the turnbuckles came down too. Did you find it at the Plaza?
